Subject:- Grant of Yearly Permission to JB Roy State Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, 170-172, Raja Dinendra Street, PO-Shyambazar, Kolkata-700004, West Bengal (Inst. ID-AYU0261) with intake capacity of 59 seats (74 Seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **JB Roy State Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, 170-172, Raja Dinendra Street, PO-Shyambazar, Kolkata-700004, West Bengal (Inst. ID-AYU0261)** inspection was conducted on **20.03.2025 and 21.03.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process **the permission with intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**
- The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. **On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

1. Herbal Garden:-

- Total number of species is 150 and there is shortcoming of 100 species against the minimum requirement of 250 and not fulfilling the criteria as per MESAR (UG) Ayurveda-2024.

2. Non-teaching staff: -

- Availability of Non-Teaching staff is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{23}{25} \times 100\% = 92\%$.

b) Shortcomings of Non-teaching staffs are as under:-

3. Hospital staffs:-

- Availability of hospital staff is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{66}{70} \times 100\% = 94.28\%$.

b) Shortcoming of Hospital staff is as under:-

4. Observation by the visitor:-

- Strirog department does not have Lithotomy Examination Tables.
- Central computerized IPD patient registration system yet not started.
- Stock registers not available in any department.

d) No transport facility for students seen for reaching Rachna practical and Dravyaguna practical in another campus which is 3 km away from college.

3) Accordingly, a clarification letter was sent to you vide letter of even no. dated 01.05.2025 in respect of the aforementioned shortcomings/defects found during assessment. In response on the same you have submitted the clarification vide an email dated 05.05.2025 enclosing a letter vide Memo no. JBR/713/2025 dated 05.05.2025 and the submitted clarification is examined in terms of concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and after verification observation is as under:-

1. Non-teaching Staffs:-

S. No.	Shortcomings	Observation
1.	Librarian in Library (One Post)	As per the submission Dr. Papri Nath, MD (Ayu.), Ph.D(Ay.), Reader, Department of Rachna Sharir is acting as Librarian i/c since 17.12.2019 and her name is shown in non teaching staff proforma also since her joining and file (No. HFW-30099/8/2022-AYUVED Sec-Dept. H&FW) has already been moved for creation of the post. Post is not created and same was rejected by the visitor as she is not qualified for the post as she is working as Reader in the Department of Rachna Sharir so cannot be considered and shortcoming persists.
2.	Asst. Librarian in Library (One Post)	Mr. Tarak Bhowmik is working as Asst. Librarian since 01.10.2015 and his name is shown in non-teaching staff proforma since his joining for filling up of the post and proposal also submitted for filling up the post. After verification it is found that, he was rejected by the visitor as not qualified for the post.

2. Hospital Staffs:-

S. No.	Shortcomings	Observation
1.	Medical Specialist (One Post)	Dr. Swapan Kumar Sarkar was appointed but due to resignation by him the post is now vacant and a proposal (No. JBR/937/2023 Dated 26.06.2023) has been already submitted for filling up the post of (One) Medical Specialist on part time basis. As per the MESAR 2024 Medical Specialist is not required so no shortcoming persist .
2.	Ophthalmologist (One Post)	Proposal (No. JBR/937/2023 Dated 26.06.2023) has been already submitted for filling up the post of (One) Ophthalmologist on part time basis again. As per the MESAR 2024 Ophthalmologist is not required so no shortcoming persist .
3.	Laboratory Technician (clinical laboratory) (Two Post)	Presently pathological service is continuing on outsourcing basis by the approval of Department of health and FW, Govt. of West Bengal since 01.06.2023 vide sanctioned order No.HFW-30099/78/2021/264 dated 15.05.2023 by Special Secretary (AYUSH), Govt. of West Bengal and accordingly Mrs. Raunak Wasi, Mr. Salauddin Sarkar and Mrs. Ankita Das are shown as laboratory technicians on outsourcing basis. However, proposal for creation of 8 Posts of MT Lab Technicians for various Departments and hospital clinical laboratory has been placed Vide No. JBR/1966/2023D 20.12.2023 for approval. Above mentioned staffs were rejected by the visitor as they are working part-time but they were present on the day of visitation. So submission may be considered.

3. Observation by the visitor:-

2.	Central computerized IPD patient registration system yet not started.	The file (No. HFW-30099/22/2024-Ayurved Sec-Dept of H&FW dated 09.04.2024) and another separate file (computer No. 967659) are under active consideration for approval in the department of Health

		and FW for routine establishment of Central IPD system with HMIS portal for all AYUSH Institutions under department of Health and FW, Govt. of West. Submission may be considered
3.	Stock registers not available in any department.	All departments except Agad tantra, Swasthavritta, Panchakarma and Shalya Tantra are maintaining stock registers during visitation. However, we have prepared now and maintaining these stocks registers henceforth. Submission may be considered
4.	No transport facility for students seen for reaching Rachna practical and Dravyaguna practical in another campus which is 3 km away from college.	There is no policy of the department to carry out the students for routine classes from one campus to another. Therefore proposal is being submitted as per your esteemed advice to the dept. regarding providing vehicle for such routine transportation purpose from State Health Transport Organization, Govt. of West Bengal as and when required. Submission may be considered.

- 4) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully re-examined once again in terms of the concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of the competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was placed in the **122nd Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on **14.05.2025** and **Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations. However, Board decided to issue yearly permission in accordance with regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations, 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2025-26.**

a) As per the seat reduction policy 2025-26:-

For deficiency in the Librarian post seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 01 seat.

Accordingly, after applying the approved seat reduction policy 2025-26 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **yearly permission with 59 seats (74 Seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)]** in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.

- 5) **Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above Yearly Permission in accordance with Regulation 54(3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 is hereby granted to JB Roy State Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, 170-172, Raja Dinendra Street, PO-Shyambazar, Kolkata-700004, West Bengal (Inst. ID-AYU0261) with an intake capacity of 59 seats (74 Seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)] in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-**

(i) It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of with 59 seats (74 Seats including EWS) [instead of 60 seats (75 Seats including EWS)]** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

- 6) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 7) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission**

shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.

- 8) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 9) **The aforementioned shortcomings and following requirements should be fulfilled by the college as per Regulation 55 (2) of MESAR 2024 and the compliance report shall be submitted before 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - The remaining shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 3 above, shall be fulfilled.
- 10) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
